At this busy time of the year, with so much going on, we can sometimes forget to stand back for a moment and appreciate all that is being done & achieved by pupils, staff, parents and governors.

I just wanted to say a few heart-felt thank –you– :

- Thank you to all involved in the London trip – to the parents for being so supportive, to the children for being so delightful and to the staff for being so caring.
- Thank you to all for working together to allow the Sports Days to go ahead on such a hot day. It was great not to have to cancel, and we are so grateful to

pupils, parents & staff for all doing their bit to make it happen and for it to be such fun.

- Thank you to everyone who has helped to get our Reception Intake meeting and transition sessions off to such a great start. Our new Reception children have impressed us so much this week and we are so grateful to the parents for being so positive and friendly.
- We are hoping that we will see all of you at the Summer Fair tomorrow. It is always so nice to see our families informally and have a chat. The fair is also such an important fund-raising event too and we have such good plans of things we want to do for the children. Every pound you spend will have a direct impact on your child next year.

Safety at Lunchtimes

It is lovely to see the children eating outside at lunchtimes and being able to enjoy their lunches in the sun. While the children and staff are really enjoying these lovely days, it has been marred a little by the presence of seagulls. Seagulls are a perennial problem across Cornwall, but we have noticed that there are a couple of things that the children are doing that could be encouraging the seagulls to be more adventurous:

- Some children are leaving their lunchboxes open while they are eating. Some beady-eyed seagulls are spotting these lunchboxes and will try to swoop down and take something. Where lunchboxes are left closed, they quickly stop trying to do this.
- Similarly, some children can be careless with the food they are eating and allow bits to fall on the floor and again the seagulls can be quick to respond to this.
- We are a little sad to say that this week we observed some Y6 boys throwing crusts in the direction of the seagulls.

We are responding to this in school both with individuals as well as with all classes in assembly. We just wanted to let you know so that hopefully you could re-inforce our message just in case your child came home and said that he/she might have been “told off” when eating outside. We are monitoring the seagulls carefully and hope to see an improvement next week. If we still have concerns then we may decide to move the children to a more sheltered place to eat.

Sun hats

Although the weather may have cooled towards the end of the week, it is still summer and the UVA rates are always high. We are encouraging all children to bring a sun

hat/cap of some kind to school especially for the time when they are down on the school field at lunchtime. The school policy is that the children can wear any (reasonable) sun hat to school, which can either be the school hat or one from home. We don't mind as long as they are protected.

Fun on the fields

It is so nice to see the children enjoying playtime on the fields. It is only natural that they should want to play a little adventurously, but please could we ask you to have a chat with them about risk-taking. Although we never like to ban activities, sometimes we have to do so to prevent the likelihood of the children hurting themselves or others. The children will be aware that all forms of wrestling are not allowed at playtimes. Although the children try to play well, it is very easy for the physicality of the wrestling to tip over into what can be, or seem to be, bullying-type behaviour. We will be discouraging the children from doing some of the more complex gymnastics as there have been incidences of children toppling over this week and injuring arms and shoulders.

Among some of our Y4 pupils, there has been a sudden interest in "boyfriends & girlfriends". Like the wrestling, discussions between children about liking someone else can suddenly turn upsetting. These sort of discussions can quick turn to group teasing and most children cannot handle this type of peer interest. Therefore, we have said to the children that we strongly discourage any talk of boyfriends and girlfriends while in school.

Show and Tell

We know that our children really enjoy and look forward to Show & Tell time in their classes. We never cease to be impressed and amused by the wonderful array of items that they bringing into school to share with us. We just wanted to draw parents' attention to the fact that one or two of our older boys have brought in pen knives recently to show their classes. The children have been very sensible in that they have given it to their class teachers for safe keeping, but there are lots of reasons why bringing a knife of any kind onto the school site is too risky to allow. Therefore, we would like to let parents and children know that pen knives (along with any sharp object of any kind) are not allowed in school for Show & Tell, for play or for any other reason.

Volunteers

We have been bowled over this year by how generous so many of you have been with your time and your talents, and have signed up as volunteers in school. As you will know, schools are incredibly busy places. Our team of staff work so hard to try and ensure that we offer as wide and enriched a curriculum as possible. Sometimes we find it hard to do all the things that we would like to do and we hope that there are parents, grandparents, governors or friends out there who might be able to help us out as volunteers:

- We are enquiring if we have any parents, or if parents might know of anyone, who has an ASA Swimming Level 1 or Level 2 who would be willing to volunteer and help out with our weekly swimming sessions (on Monday afternoons) next year. We really would welcome your support.
- The Truro Branch of the Kernow Credit Union, led by Jenny Kwee, has run a Young Savers Club all this year. Mrs Kwee will not be as available next year and we would love to recruit someone to work with her to keep this important club going within the school. Training and support would be provided. We hope

there may be someone out there – a parent, a grandparent or retired member of the community who would enjoy helping our children to develop the "saving habit" at an early age.
