#### Wet mornings

We are very fortunate that the number of wet mornings we have had this year has been relatively few but when they do happen, it does result in a change in our normal dropping off arrangements in the morning. When it is too wet to gather in the playgrounds, children are expected to go directly into their classrooms.

There are staff stationed at both the pedestrian crossing at the front of the school as well as the Infant gates and outside the Y2 classes, who will be able to confirm if wet morning procedures are in place that day.

We understand that for the Junior children it is quite straightforward for them to enter their classrooms either from the playground or the pathway outside their rooms. For our Reception and Year 1 pupils, it involves a longer walk around the outside of the school. We encourage our YR and Y1 parents to walk their children around to the classroom door on wet mornings. On the very odd occasion a child may be dropped at the gate and make their own way around to their classroom. This shouldn't be a problem as the Infant children are used to making their way to and from the playground several times a day. However, we are aware that it might feel different for a child first thing in the morning. Therefore we will be posting staff at points along the route to the YR and Y1 classrooms so that children remain in the line of sight of staff until they reach their classrooms
