#### **Attendance**

#### **Going for Goals!**

We are using the month of January to explore with the children personal goals for 2016 - 2017. Within our assemblies, I have been both delighted and impressed by the range of challenging goals that they have set themselves. Some children are choosing to try and give up something, e.g. fizzy drinks, or do less of something, e.g. less time on their iPads. Other children are looking to start something new like join a club or learn a new skill. Some are looking at ways that they can focus on a particular aspect of their behaviour or personality e.g. some have said that they want to be better time keepers this year, while others have said that they want to be able to walk away from problems in the playground and not get wound up. I could share so many more lovely examples with you, so we thought you might like to talk to your child over the weekend and find out about the goal(s) they have set themselves for this year - you might be surprised and impressed with their choices.

In helping the children to come up with their personal goals, we have been presenting them with lots of ideas. This Monday, at assembly, we suggested that some of the children (and adults!) might like to think about a personal goal linked to healthy eating and living. We made ourselves very hungry by looking at how we would create healthy, nutritious and delicious lunch boxes. Even if your child has school meals, we wanted to encourage them to try out new foods at the weekend. I hope they are able to share some new ideas with you.

One aspect of healthy living that we did particularly emphasise was the need for us all to drink lots and lots of water. Following on from the assembly, each class was

asked to talk about how they can ensure that they can easily and readily access drinking water during the school day. Every class has their own arrangements but they are broadly similar:

- Some classes have the children's water bottles on their tables and they can access them regularly during the day
- Other classes have the water bottles on a separate table or trolley and the children are given regular opportunities during the day, particularly before and after break times, to have a drink.

Most children are fairly good at drinking water across the day but we recognise that some children may forget to do so or be reluctant to do so. We have made a couple of suggestions to the children which we would like to share with you too.

- Some parents have put markers down the side
  of their child's water bottle to remind them how
  much they would like them to drink by a certain
  time in the day. In that way both the child, and
  the class teacher and TA, have a visual
  reminder during the day.
- Any parent, or child, can speak to the class teacher and ask if they can help to remind the child regularly during the day to have a drink. If the class teacher and TA are aware where there may be an issue with a child not drinking enough, then he/she could quietly arrange for them to remain back for just a minute at one or more of the break times to have an extra drink.

#### **JEFF SMITH MEMORIAL GARDEN - TESCO**

#### WE NEED YOUR VOTES TO "BAG" US THE £5,000!

Archbishop Benson School is bidding to bag a massive cash boost from the Tesco Bags of Help initiative.

Tesco teamed up with Groundwork to launch the monthly funding scheme, which sees grants of £5,000, £2,000 and £1,000 – all raised from the 5p bag levy – being awarded to local outdoor community projects.

Three groups in every Tesco region have been shortlisted to receive the cash award and this month shoppers are being invited to head along to Tesco stores to vote for who they think should take away the top grant.

Archbishop Benson School is one of the groups on the shortlist.

He would be delighted to know that our proposed memorial garden, in his honour, is a continuation of his compelling vision for the school.

In a world that is becoming increasingly busy and demanding for children, we want to create a calm and peaceful garden area that would allow our pupils to freely engage in quiet interaction and contemplation on a daily basis. We are very excited at the potential opportunity to create a landscaped outdoor area, with seating, that could be used creatively and therapeutically to enrich the lives of our children. We feel passionately about the health and wellbeing of our pupils and we know that many groups of children ranging from our Breakfast and Lunchtime Clubs through to our nurture groups and Family Learning groups would benefit enormously from such a tranquil spot, as well as being freely available to all children at Breaktimes and lunchtimes.

It would mean the world to the children, parents, staff and governors of Archbishop Benson School if we received community support and backing for this memorial garden, as we continue to endeavour to serve successive generations of Truro families to the very best that we possibly can."

Voting is open in stores from 2 January to 28 January. Customers will cast their vote using a token given to them at the check-out in store each time they shop.
