#### Message from Mrs Giblett

#### **UN International Happiness Day**

As part of our ongoing development of friendship skills and anti-bullying strategies we have spent this week celebrating happiness and positive mental attitudes.

Mrs. Lyndon has worked hard with the children to make a Wall of Happiness, which can be found in the hall. The children have written some wonderful things that make them happy. Come and take a look to put a smile on your face!

#### **Pupil Behaviour**

Over the last couple of weeks, we have had governors in school visiting classes and spending time with children and staff finding out about how the children are responding to our new approach to marking & feed back . The governors have been very complimentary about the behaviour of the children and this was also recognised in our recent Ofsted inspector when the lead inspector stated..."Inspection evidence, including visits to classrooms, shows that pupils across the school behave well;"

We are never complacent about maintaining good standards of pupil behaviour and we try to be proactive whenever concerns are shared with us. We have had a report from a Y3 parent who was concerned about playwrestling at playtime. The children are aware already that we do not encourage play wrestling - it can get out of hand guite easily and children can end up with bruises & grazes when wrestling moves are used. Last year, one child sustained a bruised back as a result of an uncontrolled wresting manoeuvre. We have reminded the children that we introduced the fabulous Play Pod equipment to allow them to have a fun & active time at break times. We would be really grateful if you could have a chat with your child, especially if you think they may be wrestling enthusiast, about playing sensibly & responsibly with their friends.

We would also be grateful if you could support us in talking to your child, particularly if they are in the Juniors, about not being tempted to use or copy bad language in the playground. From time to time, parents will feed back to us about their children learning bad language in school. When we have investigated these incidences, we generally find that children are already aware of bad language from a variety of sources ranging from siblings, family & friends through to movies and online gaming and can then try this language out at times in school.

We are really proud of our Year 6 cohort who have been very mature and sensible this year. We hope that they will help us by setting a strong example to the younger children in Years 3 & 4 who can be impressionable and copy poor examples of behaviour on occasions.

Teachers, TAs and lunchtime supervisors will be looking to praise and reward the vast majority of our pupils who behave beautifully across the course of a day. They will also be proactive in responding to the use of bad or inappropriate language. It could be that in the next few weeks your child, either individually or as part of a group, might be spoken to about unsafe play or the use of poor language. For most children, it would involve no more than a gentle reminder of our school expectations but it could be that, on the odd occasion, either a phase leader or myself might be involved. For the vast majority of children this will not affect them in any way, but we just wanted to make you aware of our focus on playground behaviour in case your child discusses it with you.


