Vacancy for a parent governor

We currently have a vacancy for a parent governor on the Governing Board, which is open to all parents and guardians of children in this school. Being a governor will afford you the opportunity to help shape and guide the strategic vision and direction of Archbishop Benson School. We really value and welcome parental involvement and would be very open to discussing how you might be able to add your knowledge and skills to our efforts.

Introducing Our New Phase Leaders

We all know that being able to talk to the right person at the right time is crucial if a large organisation such as our school is to offer our families the very best support we can. Whilst class teachers routinely communicate with parents on a daily basis at home-time, we appreciate that there are times when you may wish to seek further clarification, take concerns further or share information with the school leadership to ensure it is handled as rapidly as possible.

To ensure that senior staff are more widely available to parents and pupils, we have created 3 new Phase Leader roles this year. Each Phase Leader works closely with their team of class teachers, teaching assistants and pupils on a daily basis. In addition to enhancing communication for parents, the Phase Leaders are also directly responsible for the teaching and learning, behaviour, support and outcomes in their areas. As a result, they will have a good understanding of any issues specific to the pupils within their phase group. Importantly, each Phase Leader is also a member of the Senior Leadership Team, meaning that they are in a position to act upon situations quickly and with a full understanding of the wider issues involved. It also means they are able to ensure that, where necessary, information shared with them is fed into decision making at the highest level.

Our Phase Leaders are:

Years 1 and 2 – Mr. Crocker Years 3 and 4 – Mrs. Kyte Years 5 and 6 – Mr. Kitto

If you have spoken with a class teacher and wish to seek further information or take a matter further, please do speak to them at the end of the school day to agree what next steps should be taken. Similarly, should a more senior member of staff than your class teacher be required to deal with a situation in school that involves your child, it may well be the Phase Leader who contacts you.

We are confident that in the vast majority of cases our Phase Leaders will be able to effectively and efficiently deal with your concerns. However, should there be an occasion where they are unable to help, Mr. Galler and Mrs. Power are available, as am I.

We know they are looking forward to meeting you, so don't be shy and do feel free to pop in to their rooms and say hello at the end of the day if there is anything you would like to discuss.

If parents are interested in attending any forum, then we ask them to contact the office. On a first come, first served basis, we will ensure that if sufficient parents express an interest in attending that there is representation from all classes. Having done that, if there are additional spaces available then we open it up to the other names on the list in rank order. If we have too many requests, we may need to consider who attended forum meetings already in the year/previous year and offer it to those who have not yet attended. If a parent has attended a forum meeting in the year, it is always worth putting your name down again if you are interested in attending another meeting as some of the forums have not been fully booked.

Tremorvah Playing Fields Community Survey

Tremorvah Fitness is running a community survey from August until 30 September to see whether there is local support for an outdoor gym at Tremorvah Playing Fields. The survey results will be used in applications to funding bodies like Sport England, Truro City Council.

The ambition is to improve sports facilities at Tremorvah Playing Field and attract more users to the park by installing free, accessible and easy-to-use outdoor gym equipment, available to everyone. The gym would be installed on an all-weather surface with dynamo-powered lighting to make the equipment usable in winter.

A large park gym of up to 10 pieces would take up roughly 12 x 7 m space. Examples of equipment that could be included are cycle machines, cross trainers and The Rig, a piece of strength-building equipment.
