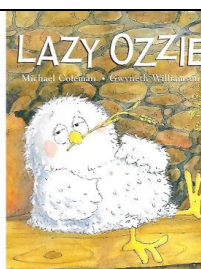

Children created a **BLUE** flag to promote our commitment to anti-bullying













June 2019			In advance of World Refugee Week, using input from our Syrian family to recognise and appreciate how much we have in common with the lives of people Syria before war there and how we must show tolerance and compassion for those who have lost everything even though they have done nothing wrong
			Using the stories of Aya (Syria), Nyaboth (Ethiopia) and Gatdet (Sudan) to remember that refugees are real people just like you & me who have lost all their treasures. Exploring how different countries and people have reacted to the arrival of refugees and why they might feel like that?

The workshop provided a range of engaging and interactive activities that equip children with vital life skills, educating and protecting them from 'Bullying', guiding them through their 'Digital Lives' and also how to 'Stay Safe' when out and about on their own.			





## The Toothpaste Challenge

Give the children either in pairs or as individuals a plate and a tube of toothpaste. The bigger tubes work best. Tell them the challenge is to get all the toothpaste out of the tube as quick as possible. Watch and see how quickly they can squirt it onto the plate. Then once the toothpaste is out let them try to get it back in. The actual challenge is to see how much toothpaste they can get back in the tube. Almost impossible. Gets really messy really fast. For the most part the toothpaste stays on the plate and all over their hands. Some try to blow into the empty tube of toothpaste to open it back up again. Doesn't work but worth suggesting to see them try. Point of the game is to be careful with your words. They can come out super fast but don't always go back in so easily and can get messy if said in the wrong way.
