Linking into National Random Acts of Kindness Day in February (17th)




Family involvement

Using the secular story – **The Lion Who Wanted To be Loved** - to explore how love & kindness can help us to change out everyday lives so that they are happier for us & all those around us




Staff involvement


Using the bible story – **The Prodigal Son** - to explore what kindness looks like on a practical level and how we could replicate that example in our own lives & communities

The Toothpaste Challenge

Give thechildren either in pairs or as individuals a plate and a tube of toothpaste. The bigger tubes work best. Tell them the challenge is to get all the toothpaste out of the tube as quick as possible. Watch and see how quickly the squirt it onto the plate. Then once the toothpaste it out let them in on the secret. The actual challenge is to see how much toothpaste they can get back in the tube. Almost impossible. Gets really messy really fast.
