Next up was a quarter final against Kea B, which we won 3-0. Finally, we were unlucky to lose 1-0 to St Agnes in the semi-final. Overall, it was a good afternoon's football and we played really well, scoring 22 goals and only conceding 1 all afternoon.

As we finished as the highest placed team in the Penair cluster, we now qualify for the Peninsula finals later in the year. Well
