#### Message from Mrs Giblett

#### Attendance News:

Our whole-school attendance rate for this week was 97.5%.

Congratulations to Carne this week who topped the attendance table with 100 % attendance. Well done!

## Happy to be in school!

It is hard to believe that we are coming to the end of the first half-term of this year. It has been incredibly busy and productive in school and it is so lovely to see the children enjoying their new year groups and their topics.

We are delighted with a whole--school attendance rate of 97.39% in Autumn 1. I had my half-termly meeting with our new Education Welfare Officer, Rita Rowson, this week and she was genuinely impressed with our overall attendance rate for last year - 96.3%. This great attendance rate reinforces how 92% of our children told us, in their end-of-year pupil surveys, that they enjoy coming to school.







Whilst Rita recognised how hard the school and parents are working together to achieve our high attendance record, she also pointed out that the national average attendance rate has slowly but steadily risen over the past few years and is now almost 96.0%. This means that schools are expected to be vigilant and proactive in staying above the 96.0% threshold.

When Rita visits us again in November, she is going to be looking at the attendance profiles for all our pupils who ended last year with an attendance rate below 95% and then checking this against their attendance rates in this half-term. In the past we have issued attendance letters to parents and/or invited them to attendance clinics where children's attendance rates have been at 90% or below but this year, Rita may well be contacting parents where their child's attendance rate is between 90% – 95%. If you are unsure of your child's attendance rate in 2016 – 2017, you will find it on their end of year report.

If you have any concerns about your child's attendance, or punctuality, and are possibly worried that you might receive a letter, then please feel free to come and see me. We have a lot of experience of supporting pupils with attendance issues and we would be more than happy to help.

#### **Training Day**

A while back I mentioned to you that we have 2 training days remaining this year. We wanted to hold them in reserve, so that we are able to plan the training we need at the best time in the year.

We have set a date for our next training day and it will be on Wednesday, December 20 – this will allow you to have a slightly earlier start to the Christmas holidays. Staff will be having training on the teaching of reading and are looking forward to introducing new books and activities to the children in the Spring term.

#### **Parents Evenings**

You will be able to book appointments for Parents Evenings straight after half-term via eSchools.

We run the parental consultation appointments over 3 evenings with one of the three evenings being a "late" evening so that we can fit in all the appointments. The teachers are looking forward to meeting with you and celebrating your child's achievements with you. With 30 pupils in the Infant classes and 32 pupils in the Junior classes, it is logistically very difficult for the teachers to fit in all parents in to those 3 days. Our established

procedure is to allocate one session, during those 3 days, to each family. Where parents are separated, they are able to offer 2 choices:

- They may choose, as many of our parents' do, to attend their allocated appointment, which is booked online, together.
- Where this is not possible, which is also the case with some of our parents, one of the parents usually books the online appointment on one of the 3 evenings and the other parent arranges an additional appointment by contacting the school office directly, usually the week after the consultation week.

Where parents choose option 2, they usually agree among themselves as to who has which appointment i.e. the online appointment or the additional appointment. They sometimes swap the arrangements around in the subsequent term so that it is fair to both parents.

Again, in order to be fair to both parents, no additional appointments, made with the school office, for a parental consultation may be booked in advance of the opening of the online appointments systems which is usually activated one week in advance of Parents Evening.

A reminder- your login will be the parent's name in small letters with a dot in the middle (eg andrew.brown) and your password will be 4 digits, which hopefully you have saved from last time.

New Reception parents will already have received this log-in from their class teachers.

#### Sweets and Treats In School

I had some parental feedback this week about the statement I made in last week's newsletter about sending cakes instead of sweets into school. Having had a helpful discussion with this parent, I wanted to clarify that statement a little.

For a variety of reasons, including religious reasons, reactions to additives and dental health, we discourage parents, and children, from sending sweets in to school. In suggesting that parents could send in cakes instead, I apologise if it seemed like I was suggesting that the school actively encourages cakes and buns being sent in as an alternative. We all know that our diets already contain plenty of sugar.

Therefore, I would appeal to parents to consider the nature of any birthday treats that they may send into school and to make it as healthy an option as possible.
