Pupil safety in the mornings

We are grateful to our Infant parents for being so supportive (and friendly) in the mornings. We would just like to draw your attention to a couple of issues that are impacting on pupil safety.

All Infant children who gather at the Infant gate before staff arrive to open the gate at 8.30am must be supervised by parents. A few Infant parents made us aware that some unsupervised Infant children are playing Tag in this area before 8.30am and that other children were being jostled. This area is quite a confined space and we would be grateful if parents could keep their children with them until they are handed over to staff.

We understand that some parents of older Infant children may choose to let their Infant children walk from the main entrance gate down to the Infant gate on their own. If this is the case, then we would just ask these parents to make sure that they do this after 8.30am. In that way, they can be sure that their child will be greeted by a member of staff and can walk straight through into the playground.

Sometimes in the morning, there may be a child who is a little upset and they can sometimes be a little reluctant to leave their parent or may even wish to return to their parent having been handed over. This is always a worry for us. So if you ever find yourself in this situation, then please feel free to hand your child over to one of the members of staff on duty, let us know what the upset might be and we will ensure that your child is handed over safely to someone in the Infant playground.

It may be that parents may have to wait a minute or two to have their child brought around as we need to ensure that one member of staff always remains at the gate to monitor that no child wanders back to the gate.


