Welcome back

I would like to extend a very warm welcome back to all members of our school community - pupils, parents (and grandparents) staff, governors, volunteers and anyone else I may have forgotten! A special word of welcome to all our new pupils and parents. We have had lots of new additions over the holidays and we are almost full, which is wonderful. We look forward to getting to know the newest members of our school family in the weeks ahead.

As you might expect, members of staff have been very busy in school during the holidays.

Lots of decoration, repairs and maintenance has been carried out including:

- Re-decoration of Yr 3 Classes
- New carpets in Yr 2 Classes
- Re-decorated school hall
- A new Rainbow Room where our SENCOs and Family Support Coordinator can work with groups of children offering support like Thrive sessions, music therapy, nurture sessions, as well as space to meet with parents informally.
- Our re-furbished flagpole!

I am sure that you will want to join with me in thanking Treve Sims and Michael Williams, our site team, who have worked very hard over the summer to get this work done. I would also like to thank the cleaning staff for their understanding and flexibility in cleaning the school and getting it ready in the midst of all the work that was going on.

Staff training

On behalf of the staff, I would like to thank you for your support and patience while we had three training days this week. These days allow us not just to have whole-staff training but also the opportunity to have precious quality discussion time together.

Pupil Health & Welfare

On the first day back we had a First Aid training day and 47 members of staff attended, which is wonderful and means that staff right across the school are now re-trained.

We like to work closely with you so that we remain aware of your child's health and medical needs. Our existing parents have previously received a copy of our Pupil Welfare Form and where a child has had particular health medical needs (e.g. asthma, allergies, dietary requirements), this form has been returned to the school and we have used this information to create Class Welfare Registers, or individual care plans, so that all this medical information is summarised for class teachers

We will be sending this form, within our School Admissions Booklet, to all our new parents. We would ask them to complete it and let us know if their child has a specific medical condition that could require support/intervention in school. If a child has no medical needs, then please record NIL across the sheet and return to school.

Although our **existing parents** have already completed this form, we ask them to consider if their child's health/medical needs have changed over time and whether the school has been informed. Parents can put this information in writing to their class teacher or share it with teachers at the Meet the Teachers sessions.

Safeguarding

Within the School Admission Booklet, new parents are also asked to complete and return the forms listed below. Thank you if you have done so already. Existing parents have already completed these forms:

Use of Images consent forms:

The front page is signed by parents to confirm that any photographic or video images taken by them at school events will only be used for personal and private use The back page is signed by parents to authorise the use of their child's image for school purposes.

- Home-School Agreement:

The Home-School agreement is a statutory requirement for all schools. It clarifies what the school is trying to achieve and seeks to engage parents and pupils as partners in this process. We ask parents and their child to sign on the appropriate line.

- Withdrawal from Religious Education (RE), Worship and/or Sex & Relationships Education (SRE)

If parents do not wish their child to take part in RE or SRE, then they should complete the required section.

We do not re-issue these forms annually, but we will remind you of their existence and that it is the responsibility of the parent or legal guardian to inform the school if you wish to alter information or consent at a later stage.

- Acceptable Use of Technology agreement

We all know that digital technologies have become integral to the lives of children and young people, both within schools and outside school. These technologies are powerful tools, which open up new opportunities for everyone. These technologies can stimulate discussion, promote creativity and stimulate awareness of context to promote effective learning. Young people should have an entitlement to safe internet access at all times. Therefore, we have decided that the start of the year is a good time to update and re-issue our Acceptable Use of ICT Agreement. This agreement is intended to ensure:

- that our pupils will be responsible users and stay safe while using the internet and other digital technologies for educational, personal and recreational use.
- that school systems and users are protected from accidental or deliberate misuse that could put the security of the systems and pupils at risk
- that our pupils have good and safe access to digital technologies to enhance their learning and that they will, in return, agree to be responsible users.

Some classes have sent these KS1 & KS2 Agreements home already and some will be sent out next week. Class teachers will have discussed the Agreement with their pupils, but we would welcome parental support as well, which is why we are sending home the Agreement for you to discuss with your child in the comfort of your own home, to both sign the document and to then return the form to school. We would ask that the signed agreement is returned as soon as possible, as we must have these forms before children can access online learning in The Hub

School Fitness Week

We have an action-packed year ahead of us and we are kicking it off by getting involved in School Fitness Week. Joe Wicks, perhaps better known as The Body Coach, is committed to getting the nation trying to get 'Lean in 15". He has now turned his attention to helping schools to get active for the start of term.

Joe has a simple aim: to get kids moving. He was once a teaching assistant and is now returning to his roots in an effort to turn around what he sees as a concerning trend in which children and teenagers shun opportunities to get fit. For the entire week starting 11 September, he will be running an online live 30-minute high-intensity interval training (HIIT) session for schools every morning at 10am, and Archbishop Benson will be joining in!

Meet & Greet sessions

In the week beginning September 18th, we will be holding our 'Meet The Teacher' meetings for parents and carers of children in Years 1 – 6. Teachers are very much looking forward to meeting with you and getting to know you, and your children, better. This will be an opportunity for staff to share basic expectations and routines with you, covering areas such as homework, reading, P.E., spellings, etc. It is also your opportunity to ask about anything to do with the day-to-day routine of the class your child is in.

If you have more specific questions that are relevant to your child as an individual, please feel free to speak to your teacher more privately at the end of the session.

We have timed the sessions to take place at the start of the school day. The children will be brought into their classrooms at 8.45 and once the class teachers have arranged with the TAs to supervise them, they will meet parents in the school hall. We appreciate that it may be difficult for some parents to attend these sessions, so please don't worry if you can't make it on the day. Staff are always happy to see you at the end of any day when you are collecting your child or if you wish to arrange an appointment

Pupil Premium

At the Meet The Teacher meetings, teachers will have drawn your attention to the Free School Meals & Pupil Premium letter. This is a really important letter and we are asking all our parents to take the time to read it and see if it applies to them.

If you are eligible for free school meals in any year group, it is very important to sign up as registering could also raise an extra £1300 per registered child for Archbishop Benson School from central government to fund valuable support like intervention programmes, small group support, new resources.

KS2 children

- if you want your child to have a free healthy meal at lunchtime, that is great - they will get a free meal (saving

you more than £350 a year) as well as other extra benefits and the school gets the **extra £1300 per child.**

 If you don't want your child to have the school meals they can continue as normal – as long as you qualify and are registered, the school still gets the extra £1300 per child. By registering you make sure that your child and others in their class don't miss out.

Uniform

It was lovely to see the children looking so smart at our first whole-school assembly of the year. We are all proud of our very distinctive and attractive school uniform and we thank parents for being so supportive in terms of maintaining high standards of dress.

Having reflected on school uniform during our training days, we just have a few reminders to share with parents **Shoes**: By the end of last year, some school shoes had worm out and children were wearing other shoes, including trainers to school. While we try to be understanding of this at the end of a year, we would ask that parents check and ensure that children, especially our Y5/6 pupils, are wearing correct shoes to school and not trainers.

Hair accessories: Again, by the end of last year, some pupils were coming to school with increasingly larger and colourful hair bands and bows to school. While we like to give the children a degree of freedom in the hair accessories that they wear, we would ask that they are small and discreet. Larger and bright hair accessories are best enjoyed at the weekend.

Summer uniform: We are happy for children to continue to wear Summer uniform for the present. If your child is still wearing a summer dress (which is lovely to see), please can you remember that she must wear white socks with this and not red tights, which are part of the winter uniform. We also like to see shorts still being worn

Ties: In our Uniform Policy, we state that, depending on the weather and temperatures when we return from the summer holidays, we allow our Junior children not to wear school ties up to Autumn half term. Having looked at the long-term forecast, we can see that we are not going to be blessed with an Indian summer, therefore we would like all our Junior children to resume wearing ties from next week.

Dropping Off and Collection Arrangements

Today we experienced a wet start to the day. It seems like a good time to remind parents of what the **dropping off** and collection arrangements procedures are both for wet and dry days.

We are always delighted to see our pupils and parents in the morning, but we would like to remind parents that staff do not come on duty until <u>8.30</u> and therefore children should not be left on the school grounds alone before that time. Staff on duty, who should be identifiable by their hiviz jackets, are more than happy to assist parents in the morning and are really good at passing on messages to class teachers. Most of them carry a pack of post-it notes just for that purpose. The school day starts at 8.45 when the school bell rings and children line up to walk into their classrooms. To help the children in understanding about being on time, we use the phrase in school – to be on time, be in the line.

On dry mornings

 All Infant children should come to the red Infant gate, say goodbye to their parents and then walk into Infant playground. There are members of staff on duty at the gate and in the playground as well as Junior play leaders to encourage the children to play and socialise together before school.

- For our new Reception children starting from 18th
 Sept drop children off at the Infant gate where staff will be their to greet and assist.
- For our Junior children, they should come into the Junior playground. There are members of staff on duty in the playground and we encourage the children to play and socialise before the bell rings.

On wet mornings:

- Children in Years 2, 3 & 4 should enter the school building by the entrance door beside the red Infant gate. There will be members of staff on duty there to assist.
- Reception and Year 1 pupils can be brought to their classroom doors by parents.
- Children in Years 5 and 6 should enter their classrooms directly through their external doors.

The staff on duty will make the decision as to whether it is too wet to stay outside. If it is raining as you come into school, if there is no member of staff on the playground and there are no children in the playground, it is safe to assume that our wet play procedure is in force. Duty staff will remain at the crossings, turn around and KS1 drop off point to direct traffic, ensure safety of children and answer queries on wet days.

After school

- Adults who are collecting children in Years 5 & 6 should gather in the Junior playground. The Y5 & 6 teachers will release their pupils in an orderly manner and the children will either walk home or go to meet their parent/carer in the playground.
- Adults who are collecting children from the Year 1 classes should gather next the fenced off area in the Junior playground and the Year 1 staff will hand their pupils over to the adults. Please do not enter the Year 1 area through the gate.
- Adults collecting children from the Year 2 classes should gather outside the classrooms and the Year 2 staff will hand their pupils over to the adults.
- Adults collecting children from the Year 3 & 4 classes should gather in the Infant playground and the Year 3 & 4 teachers will come into the playground and hand children over to the adults
